




We Live and Work in a Great Place!

- Northern California includes:
 - An underutilized deepwater seaport that could be used to ship Nor Cal products internationally.
 - Some of the most agriculturally-rich areas in the world.
 - Abundant natural resources (timber, minerals, etc)
 - Several commercial and recreational fishing facilities and small craft harbors
 - Two Class 1 railroads
 - Interstate and State highway connections




Northern California Trade Corridor Boundary

Objectives of the Northern California Chamber Alliance

- Explore new or expanded business relationships;
- Coordinate legislative agendas;
- Improve competitiveness and agency responsiveness; and
- Coordinate potential solutions or approaches to regional issues and needs.

Explore New or Expanded Business Relationships

- Explore trade opportunities through Chamber-to-Chamber communication
- Bring Nor Cal businesses together to take advantage of any synergies
- Create transportation and goods movement jobs in Northern California
- Improve road, rail and maritime transportation infrastructure
- Improve efficiency and reliability of goods movement
- Cut transit times and improve efficiencies of international shipments originating in Northern California
- Example: Land Bridge Pilot Project
 - The Land Bridge Pilot Project is an effort to utilize the highway transportation (Highway 299) to export Sacramento Valley commodities through Humboldt Bay's deepwater seaport
 - Land Bridge is actively connecting producers with marine terminal owners in Humboldt Bay

Coordinate Legislative Agendas

- Unify legislative responses to legislative actions
- Share in legislative advocacy for common issues
- Annually define regional legislative prioirties

Improve Competitiveness and Agency Responsiveness

- Collectively create a larger "voice" for regional initiatives.
- Improve State and Federal grant competitiveness.
- Coordinate standardized response to agency policies or regulations
- Coordinate contacts and leads with GoBiz
- Support for common transportation improvements (e.g. Hwy 299 improvements)

Coordinate Potential Solutions or Approaches to Regional Issues and Needs

- Through Alliance meetings and website, Chambers can ask questions of other Chambers, compare notes and post urgent action and support requests for regional issues, such as:
 - Pursue joint marketing efforts
 - Coordinate Foreign Trade Zone utilization
 - Homeless issues and solutions
